The proposed port at Cape Hardy is an exciting opportunity for the State. We encourage interested parties to register a non-binding preliminary interest so that we may fully understand your potential operational requirements and capabilities in order to maximise the benefits of this important development to the region.



Cape Hardy

- Located in the southeastern Eyre Peninsula region, on the Spencer Gulf, approximately 80km north of Port Lincoln, 24km north of Tumby Bay and 7km south of Port Neill.
- Supports both Panamax and Capesize vessels, no dredging required.
- Iron ore shiploader capacity of 70 million tonnes per annum.
- Potential for multiple berths in addition to the iron ore facility.
- 1,100 ha of gulf front land owned by Iron Road to support third party requirements.
- South Australian Government's assessment of Iron Road's major development application is well advanced, with approval expected early 2017.
- Current scheduling assumes project construction will commence in 2018 with port facilities progressively available from mid-2019.



- Engagement with potential users early in the development of the facilities at Cape Hardy will assist us in understanding their needs.
