Accredited Training for Sexual Violence Responses

The Australian Government is inviting eligible organisations to apply for up to \$4.494 million GST exclusive (across FY2019-20 to FY2021-22) to develop and deliver free training to frontline workers across Australia to better recognise and respond to all people who experience sexual violence.

Sexual violence may form part of family and domestic violence or as a standalone form of violence, and requires specific and specialised skills, capabilities and responses from frontline workers. These workforces could also work with clients to provide crisis support or referrals or assist with recovery.

The Australian Government has committed \$2.472 million GST exclusive (across FY2019–20 to FY2021–22) to develop and deliver primary prevention activities that encourage men to be positive role models. This grant is funded under the Fourth Action Plan of the *National Plan to Reduce Violence against Women and their Children 2010-2022* (National Plan).

Preventing violence before it occurs is the foundation of the Fourth Action Plan. Organisations are invited to apply for funding to deliver innovative primary prevention activities that involve men as positive role models to drive changes in the behaviours and attitudes that contribute to violence against women and children.

Tackling Tough Times Together

Funds could also support activities that engage your local community in being proactive, exploring options and creating something that will stand the test of tough times.

Grants of up to \$20,000 are now available across drought-affected communities nationally. A smaller number of grants valued at up to \$60,000 and \$150,000 are also available for larger-scale and multi-year projects that have a broader impact. 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Active Club Program

Round 48 of the Active Club Program is for program and equipment up to and including \$5,000 for costs associated with conducting programs to develop or improve the service the Club provides and/or the cost of consumable equipment, uniforms or ground maintenance equipment.

Local clubs are being urged to apply for funding for an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) through this grant. AED prices vary but a standard cost is about \$2,500- \$3,000 and can be registered with SA Health at no extra cost, so that callers can be directed to the closest device if an emergency occurs.

Local Schools Community Fund

The Australian Government is providing \$30.2 million in 2019–20 for the Local Schools Community Fund (the Fund), with up to \$200,000 available for each federal electorate. The Fund will benefit students and assist schools to meet their priorities through the contribution of funding for small scale projects and their associated costs.

The Fund is open to all schools—government, Catholic and independent.

Schools can apply for funding for one project between \$1,000 and \$20,000. Where a school is composed of multiple campuses, the school or campus may submit an application for each campus to fund a project between \$1,000 and \$20,000.

Funding requested can be for the total cost of the project, or part of the cost where the school contributes an amount.

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Supporting Younger Veterans Program

Australian Government - Drought Communities Programme

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Cyber Security Small Business Program

The \$10 million Cyber Security Small Business Program provides small businesses with 19 or fewer employees with grants of up to \$2,100 for up to 50 percent of the cost of a certified small business health check.

The Council of Registered Ethical Security Testers Australia and New Zealand (CREST ANZ) is approved to conduct to cyber security health checks with small business.

The aim of the program is to help small business understand their cyber security vulnerabilities and then make considered investments to protect their business. The program will run for the remainder of 2019/20.

On-Farm Emergency Infrastructure Rebate Scheme

The Australian and SA Governments are offering a rebate to drought affected farmers who invest in urgently-needed on-farm water infrastructure for livestock.

Eligible farmers can access a 25% rebate – up to \$25,000 – on new purchases and installation costs for on-farm water infrastructure to help them provide water to livestock in the current drought and be better prepared for future dry conditions

Farmers will be eligible to apply through PIRSA for the rebates, which will also cover eligible work undertaken since 1 July 2018

Caravan Parks Defib Subsidy

In 2019, the Federal Government in partnership with Caravan Industry Association of Australia, launched a Caravan Park Defibrillator Subsidy Program for Caravan Parks to encourage operators to install these devices to help save the lives of those people experiencing a sudden cardiac arrest.

The funding of \$1 million from the government will match dollar to dollar up to \$1000 per unit (excluding GST) purchased by an operator.

In regional Australia, the caravan park is often central to the community and one of the few businesses that is accessible 24h a day 7 days a week in the event of required access to a defibrillator. Although there has been an increased supply of defibs into sporting clubs, these venues are only accessible when sports are being played. As such, Caravan Parks can play an important role in supporting a local community's health service.

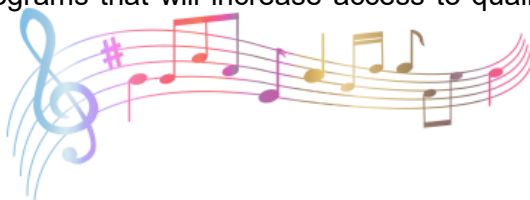
Carefully targeted programs support artists and organisations through flexible funding arrangements that include triennial, annual and project-specific agreements.

Bite-Size Grants

Liquor Licensing – RSA Exemptions

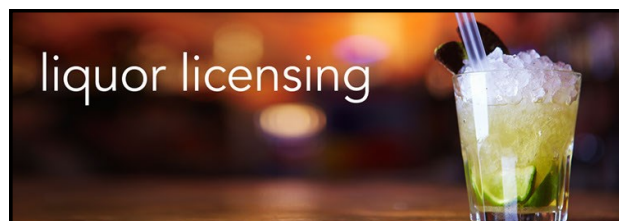
Every business with a liquor licence that is open to the public needs an approved responsible person supervising and managing the premises during operating times.

However, if you can prove to the Consumer and Business Services (CBS) that an exemption would not compromise the responsible service and consumption of liquor, you can be open to the public without a responsible person.

CBS must be satisfied that the exemption would not compromise the responsible service and consumption principles and your club will need to provide evidence and details for a number of subjects.

Handy Tips for community groups

Justice Connect's Not-for-Profit organisation suggests there are a few tips you can take to find out your organisation's legal structure. If your organisation is a charity, the best place to look is on the ACNC register. Once you have found your organisation's entry, you can check your rules or constitution, which should state the type of legal structure. You can search by name, ABN or CAN.

If your organisation is not a charity, start with the Australian Business Register. You will need the name and ideally the ABN or ACN of your organisation. If your group is a state-based not-for-profit structure such as an incorporated association or a co-operative, it is likely that the ABR will list it as "Other Incorporated Entity". You will then need to search your state / territory regulator of not-for-profits to confirm your structure.
