- Category 3 - Large grants for small shows
- Category 4 - Large grants for large shows

Tackling Tough Times Together

The Tackling Tough Times Together grant program helps communities access the resources they need to support one another through the ongoing effects of the drought. Grants of up to \$20,000 are now available across drought-affected communities nationally. A smaller number of grants valued at up to \$60,000 and \$150,000 are also available for larger-scale and multi-year projects that have a broader impact. Applications will be accepted on an ongoing basis and assessed quarterly.

National Taxonomy Research Grants

The Australian Biological Resources Study National Taxonomy Research Grant Program provides grants for research into taxonomy and systematics and to support the training and/or recruitment of taxonomists.

The program is the only grant program in Australia that is targeted towards the support of research into taxonomy, to:

- improve our knowledge of the Australia biota through targeted taxonomic research
- increase funding for taxonomy through enhanced co-funding opportunities
- build Australia's taxonomic capacity by supporting tertiary research training and early career researchers.

The Disability, Mental Health and Carers program provides support and community-based initiatives for people with disability or mental illness and for carers so they can develop their capabilities and actively participate in community and economic life.

The objective of this grant opportunity is to provide grants to conference organisers to help people with disability participate in nationally-focused, disability-related, conferences held in Australia. Grants will support eligible conference organisers to provide accessibility measures that will maximise the inclusion and participation of people with disability at their conference.

The intended outcomes of this grant opportunity that are expected to be achieved by funding conference organisers are:

- people with disability are provided with greater opportunities to participate in all areas of Australian life by assisting them and their carers with the costs of attending disability related conferences that might otherwise be inaccessible to them
- greater participation and inclusion of people with disability at nationally-focused, disability-related conferences held in Australia

**Grants for Seniors**

Positive Ageing Fellowship Grants

One-off community capacity building grants of \$20,000 - \$40,000 for projects that support a diverse range of older South Australians to age well and be recognised for their valued contributions across their lifetime.

Age Friendly SA Grants

One-off grants of up to \$25,000 for local governments. Regional partnerships of 3 or more local governments may be eligible for up to \$45,000. Projects must align to the *Age Friendly SA Strategy* key priorities.

Charter Boat Diversification Program

The Charter Boat Diversification grants program will boost opportunities for the operators and support South Australia's reputation as a fantastic fishing and nature destination.

Applicants can seek grants from \$2,000 up to \$25,000 for the following types of projects:

- Improvements to boat amenities (e.g. fridge, catering equipment, seating)
- Improvements in boat accessibility (e.g. disability, elderly)
- Marketing, promotions and booking management systems
- To purchase equipment that will deliver new customer experiences
- Upgrade of boat survey and associated boat alterations
- Boat alterations to support tag-and-release science work
- Boat alterations to support new customer experiences
- Business strategies to plan for diversification

Applications to the Charter Boat Diversification Program are limited to active charter licence holders, and a minimum 50:50 project funding contribution is required.

Cyber Security Small Business Program

The \$10 million Cyber Security Small Business Program provides small businesses with 19 or fewer employees with grants of up to \$2,100 for up to 50 percent of the cost of a certified small business health check.

The Council of Registered Ethical Security Testers Australia and New Zealand (CREST ANZ) is approved to conduct to cyber security health checks with small business. The aim of the program is to help small business understand their cyber security vulnerabilities and then make considered investments to protect their business. The program will run for the remainder of 2019/20.

Australian Government - Drought Communities Programme

Provides Eligible Councils with up to \$1 million for local community infrastructure and other drought relief projects for communities impacted by drought. The extension of the Drought Communities Programme provides funding of \$81 million in 2018-19 to Eligible Councils to deliver benefits to targeted drought-affected regions of Australia.

The program will support local community infrastructure and other drought relief projects for communities impacted by drought. Contact your local council for more information.

Applications close 1 December 2020 for District Council of Peterborough & Outback Communities Authority**On-Farm Emergency Infrastructure Rebate Scheme**

The Australian and SA Governments are offering a rebate to drought affected farmers who invest in urgently-needed on-farm water infrastructure for livestock.

Eligible farmers can access a 25% rebate – up to \$25,000 – on new purchases and installation costs for on-farm water infrastructure to help them provide water to livestock in the current drought and be better prepared for future dry conditions. Farmers will be eligible to apply through PIRSA for the rebates, which will also cover eligible work undertaken since 1 July 2018

The funding of \$1 million from the government will match dollar to dollar up to \$1000 per unit (excluding GST) purchased by an operator.



In regional Australia, the caravan park is often central to the community and one of the few businesses that is accessible 24h a day 7 days a week in the event of required access to a defibrillator. Although there has been an increased supply of defibs into sporting clubs, these venues are only accessible when sports are being played. As such, Caravan Parks can play an important role in supporting a local community's health service.

FRRR Strengthening Rural Communities

The Strengthening Rural Communities (SRC) program aims to give the thousands of small rural, regional and remote communities across Australia an opportunity to apply for funding that can support broad community needs.

The program criteria are deliberately flexible, and with applications being accepted all year round, communities have increased access to funds that can be used where and when a community knows it's needed.

The Strengthening Rural Communities program has two funding tiers:

1. Small & Vital grants

Small & Vital grants are all about meeting an immediate small scale need within a community, or for giving a boost to a larger initiative.

- The Small & Vital grants provide funds of up to \$10,000.
- Applications are accepted year round via our online application system and awarded quarterly.

2. Larger Leverage grants

Through the Larger Leverage grants, small rural, regional and remote communities now have an opportunity to access funding to support more aspirational objectives, think bigger and leverage the ideas, creativity and resources of communities for bigger impacts and stronger, more connected communities.

The Larger Leverage tier is focussed on supporting two types of projects:

Remote communities | Additional Financial Support required

Expressions of interest (EOI) are required to apply for this tier, deadlines for which are listed below.

- The larger leverage grants provide funds between \$10,001 to \$25,000.
- Community groups can apply for the larger leverage grants twice a year - see the funding rounds table below.

Coast Participation Grants

The Coast Protection Board's Coastal Participation Grants support volunteer groups to partner with local government to undertake small-scale coastal management initiatives. Grants of up to \$10,000 are available.

The objectives of these grants are to:

- Involve community participation in coastal and marine management.
- Enhance community skills and knowledge in rehabilitation, restoration and conservation of the coast and marine environment.
- Facilitate partnerships in coastal management.
- Encourage environmental protection in the wider community.
- Achieve practical management actions and on-ground works which enhance conservation values and/or tackle the causes of coast and marine degradation.

The grant funding will be delivered by the Coast Protection Board with the support of the Department for Environment and Water (DEW). In accordance with the Coast Protection Act 1972, the Board can provide grants of up to 80 per cent of the total cost of approved coastal projects. Applicants must contribute a minimum of 20 per cent of the total project costs, which can include cash or in-kind support.

To be eligible for a Coastal Participation Grant, volunteer group(s) must partner with a coastal council.

Bite-Size Grants

The Northern and Yorke NRM Board's Grants program provides funding to community groups and not-for-profit organisations to enable them to undertake projects that deliver positive environmental outcomes across the Northern and Yorke NRM Region.

A portion of the Community Grants budget has been allocated to the Bite-Size Grants program, to provide support for small, short-term projects ranging from \$200 - \$500.

This program is funded through the Northern and Yorke Natural Resources Management Board and particular NRM priorities must be met. Project funds must be acquitted, and a completion report submitted within 3 months of receiving the grant money.



These grants are designed to increase awareness and positive action for groups in NRM and sustainability in project areas such as garden development, weed control, revegetation etc. Potential projects may fund training events, purchase of resources, contracting services or development of educational materials.

The Youngcare Home Support Grant provides up to \$20,000 for essential equipment, home modifications and services such as respite or in-home care, household items and utilities.

Youngcare's Home Support Grant can provide funding where there are critical gaps in an NDIS participant's plan, but there is still clear evidence of need. The grant also seeks to bridge the gap in essential services and support for families in need, during the transitional period while the NDIS is fully established.

The Retailer Energy Efficiency Scheme (REES)

A South Australian Government energy efficiency scheme that provides incentives for South Australian households and businesses to save energy. It does this through establishing energy efficiency and audit targets to be met by electricity and gas retailers.

South Australian households and businesses may be able to access discounted or free energy efficiency activities from energy retailers participating in the REES. Low-income households may also be able to receive an energy audit.

The Minister has set the approved REES energy efficiency activities; however, each energy retailer participating in the scheme decides on what mix of those energy efficiency activities it will undertake to meet its targets.

To find out what activities energy retailers are currently offering, you can contact any of the obliged energy retailers in South Australia, not just the retailer currently supplying you. Energy retailers may contract out their energy audits and energy efficiency activities to third-party contractors, and you may also contact these third-party contractors directly.

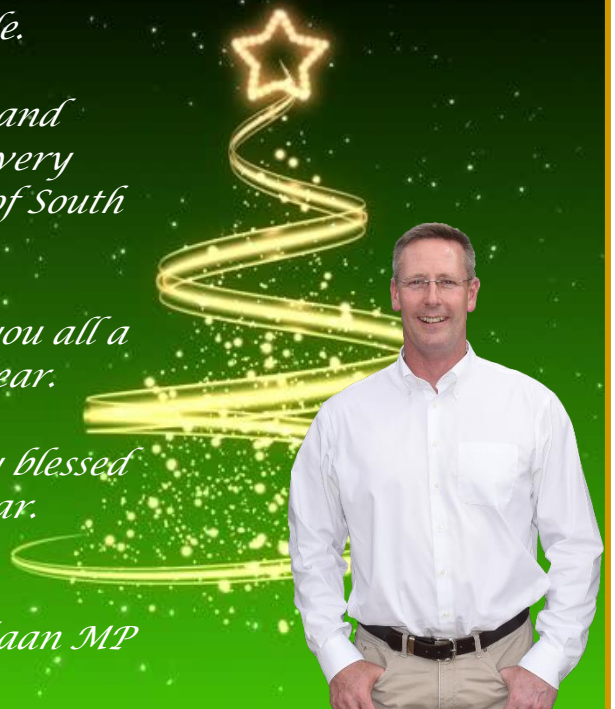
