SA GOVT COVID-19 Support Grant

Due to the COVID-19 public health emergency, the normal Grants SA program is ceasing operations until further notice.

The 'COVID-19 Support Grant' is a modified Grants SA initiative that has been released to support not-for-profit organisations continue to provide services to vulnerable and disadvantaged people in South Australia in the current circumstances of the COVID-19 public health emergency.

Grants of up to \$10,000 are available to eligible not-for-profit community organisations so they can continue to deliver programs during the COVID-19 public health emergency.

Funding is prioritised for organisations that can demonstrate that the requested items are required due to the direct impact of the COVID-19 public health emergency on their services either by needing to adapt services to meet increased demand or continuing to provide services within the restricted public health requirements.

Funding is available for items, services and resources that have been purchased from 22 March 2020.

Projects should also achieve the objectives of providing benefits to people and/or communities who are vulnerable or experiencing disadvantage.

Applications will be assessed when submitted so no need to wait for the round to close.

The purpose of the grant opportunity is to provide funding to peak youth advocacy organisations and a national peak body to represent young people, in particular those who are marginalised, and enable improved engagement and consultation with government in the development of future policies and strategies that affect them directly. Coast Participation Grants

The Coast Protection Board's Coastal Participation Grants support volunteer groups to partner with local government to undertake small-scale coastal management initiatives.

The objectives of these grants are to:

- Involve communities in coastal management.
- Enhance community skills and knowledge in rehabilitation, restoration and conservation of the coast and marine environment.
- Facilitate partnerships in coast and marine management.
- Encourage environmental protection in the wider community.
- Achieve practical management actions and on-ground works which enhance conservation values and/or tackle the causes of coast and marine degradation.

Volunteer groups need to partner with a coastal council, and the council will administer the grant on behalf of the volunteer group.

The Board can provide grants of up to 80% of the *total cost* of approved projects. Applicants contribute a minimum of 20% of the total project cost, *which may comprise cash or in-kind support*.



Revitalising Private Conservation Heritage Agreement Grants

The *Revitalising Private Conservation in South Australia* program is an exciting new collaboration between the primary industries and conservation sectors. The program provides existing and aspiring Heritage Agreement owners with an opportunity to access advice, connect with other heritage agreement owners, and access grants to plan and undertake important nature conservation works on their properties. It aims to expand the number, extent and quality of protected areas of native vegetation on private land in South Australia.



The Heritage Agreements Grants Program offers funding to current and aspiring owners of Heritage Agreements to plan and undertake activities on those Heritage Agreements, including purchase of materials and services for pest plant and animal control programs, fencing, revegetation and threatened species assessments to name a few.

Two initial grant rounds are on offer:

- **Small grants** - up to \$10,000, for better managing Heritage Agreement areas, applications open now.
- **Large grants** - more than \$10,000, aimed at achieving landscape-scale conservation outcomes across multiple properties, on offer later in 2020.

2020 Governor's Civic Awards for Schools

The Governor's Civics Awards for Schools is a cross-sector initiative open to all South Australian schools, including government, Catholic and independent. The awards aim to develop student awareness and skills as active and informed citizens in a multicultural and democratic society. They have been designed to align to the Australian Curriculum: History and Civics and Citizenship.



In 2020 the awards are available for years 5 to 12 and include individual, group and school categories. In the individual category students will respond to a history and/or civics question. In the group category schools will submit the work of a school group in the area of civic involvement. The school's category invites schools to nominate their civics and citizenship education program as an example of outstanding practice.

A maximum of 4 individual student entries and 2 group nominations per school can be forwarded for judging by the Governor's Civics Awards for Schools judging panel. The winners of the 2020 awards will be announced on Proclamation Day 2020 and awardees will be invited to a reception at Government House to receive their awards early in 2021.

Advancing Pest Animal and Weed Control Solutions

The Cherish II Fund has been informed by the First Nations Roundtables and the sector discussions and consultations in which the themes have focused on the sector priorities and needs through the COVID-19 pandemic.



Australian Government

Cherish II Fund grants are available to First Nations individuals, groups and organisations to:

- Protect senior custodians and elders as they are the source of cultural knowledge for cultural and artistic expressions through song, dance, story, images and narrative.
- Explore and interrogate artistic and creative methodologies and processes to construct innovative models of creating artistic works.
- Developing creative entrepreneurship through innovative business models to increase the ability of artists and creatives to manage and sustain a career portfolio through the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Support the professional skill development of arts workers to increase capacity and capability in navigating a digital world.
- Development of partnerships and co-funding to deliver projects of scale.



The Cherish II Fund has four (4) grant streams, they are:

- **Living Libraries:** supporting our cultural knowledge and intergenerational collaborations
- **Creative Practice:** supporting artistic creative expression
- **Creative Entrepreneur:** supporting business models to expand your practice
- **Creative Workforce:** supporting our artworkers in a digital world

Applications should be considerate of COVID-19 gathering restrictions put in place by state and federal governments.

The applicant will need to show where the remaining budget for the program (not including the applied for amount from the Australia Council) is coming from.

Events must:

- be open to the community | offer free or low-cost entry
- aim to help build community resilience & wellbeing | be held before 15 June 2021.

Events can be (but aren't limited to) a:

- picnic | online party | seminar | dance | sports carnival | open air cinema | car rally
- concert | quiz night | street party | reunion | laser light show | barbeque | arts festival

Under the current COVID-19 restrictions, events can be virtual or planned for when restrictions have eased.

Your organisation can be:

- a community or industry group | a club or association | local government.

Your organisation must also be located within an eligible drought-affected local government area.

The program is a competitive process and priority funding will be given to regions significantly affected by drought.

Grants are available for a broad range of grassroots, community-led initiatives that directly and clearly benefit local communities. Applications are accepted on an ongoing basis and assessed quarterly.

Three tiers of grants are available:

- **Up to \$20,000** – projects to be finalised within 18 months of approval;
- **Up to \$60,000** – projects to be finalised within 18 months of approval;
- **Up to \$150,000** – applications for this tier are by Expression of Interest, and multi-year projects (up to three years) are welcomed. Applicants must speak with the TTTT team to discuss their project before applying.

Bite-Size Grants

The Northern and Yorke NRM Board's Grants program provides funding to community groups and not-for-profit organisations to enable them to undertake projects that deliver positive environmental outcomes across the Northern and Yorke NRM Region.

A portion of the Community Grants budget has been allocated to the Bite-Size Grants program, to provide support for small, short-term projects ranging from \$200 - \$1000. This program is funded through the Northern and Yorke Natural Resources Management Board and particular NRM priorities must be met. Project funds must be acquitted and a completion report submitted within 3 months of receiving the grant money.



These grants are designed to increase awareness and positive action for groups in NRM and sustainability in project areas such as garden development, weed control, revegetation etc. Potential projects may fund training events, purchase of resources, contracting services or development of educational materials.

The Retailer Energy Efficiency Scheme (REES)

A South Australian Government energy efficiency scheme that provides incentives for South Australian households and businesses to save energy. It does this through establishing energy efficiency and audit targets to be met by electricity and gas retailers.



South Australian households and businesses may be able to access discounted or free energy efficiency activities from energy retailers participating in the REES.

Low-income households may also be able to receive an energy audit. The Minister has set the approved REES energy efficiency activities; however, each energy retailer participating in the scheme decides on what mix of those energy efficiency activities it will undertake to meet its targets.

To find out what activities energy retailers are currently offering, you can contact any of the obliged energy retailers in South Australia, not just the retailer currently supplying you. Energy retailers may contract out their energy audits and energy efficiency activities to third-party contractors, and you may also contact these third-party contractors directly.
